

## Public Service Commission holds meeting on Water Management Rate Hike Request

On April 25, the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC) held a town meeting at the Jay Abbott Fire Hall. More than 70 residents of St. George Island attended the meeting with several Civic Club members addressing the Commission. No one spoke in favor of the rate hike. PSC employee Bart Fletcher chaired the meeting with Todd Brown of the Division of Economic Regulation in attendance. Erik Sayler, Office of Public Counsel, which represents the consumer in these rate request matters, was also in attendance.

Water Management Services, Inc. (WMSI) Executives and employees attended the meeting. They sat at the rear of the room, but could not speak because this was an opportunity for the customers to address the PSC. The decision on the rate request is due on July 31 with a protest period of 90 days available to the utility and to the customers, depending on the decision. Fortunately, the weather on Sunday was beautiful. In spite of the weather, the Challenge brought 300 climbers from all over the U.S. to St. George Island.
