# Sheriff Mike Mock Addresses Membership

Franklin County Sheriff Mike Mock talked about his goals for Franklin County and St. George Island, followed by a question and answer session.

Mike said he was employed by the citizens of Franklin County and would do his best to serve us. He mentioned that losing the last election to Skip Shiver was very hard but made him determined to do a better job. Mike was asked about providing more visibility of Deputies, not only during Chili Cookoff and Spring Break, but throughout the year. One member related a deputy

once came by to introduce herself and to say that she was going to be on the Island that day. The member said that as a volunteer in Lighthouse Park, it was good to know that the deputy was available. Mike not only made note of this, but took notes on almost every question he was asked. He also clarified who was in charge of closing the bridge during storms and replied that the DOT was responsible for closing the bridge whenever sustained winds exceeded 50 mph. He acknowledged that some people blamed Commissioner Pinki Jackel for the bridge closing during Tropical Storm Debby last year. He said that just was not true. Some other members suggested that they station a deputy on the Island side of the bridge to stop people from going across and then not being allowed to return. He made a note of this and said he would look into finding better ways to handle the closing of the bridge. (Editor's note: Mike Mock was not Sheriff during **Tropical Storm Debby.**)
