#### Presentation made to Carrabelle City Commission to take over SGI Water Again

At the January Carrabelle Commission meeting, land developer Gene Langston made a suggestion that Carrabelle take over the SGI water system and provide a sewage treatment plant. He said Carrabelle could ask for BP money to finance the acquisition and either build a sewage treatment plant on the Island or pump the sewage across the Bay to Carrabelle. The idea of pumping sewage across the Bay generated opinions that this pipe would not be approved by any Environmental Agency. City Commissioner Brenda LaPaz, who is in charge of the water and sewer system in Carrabelle, brought up several reasons that Carrabelle should not take up this issue again. This discussion was tabled until the next Commission meeting in February. The St. George Island (See Water, Page Two)

# Social Security was the subject at January Meeting

St. George Island Civic Club member Jamie Myers addressed the January meeting on the need to plan for Social Security. When he asked the members how many were receiving Social Security (SS), about 3/4 held up their hands. Jamie emphasized that one of the biggest decisions that should be made is when to start taking SS. Two key risks in retirement planning are living longer than expected and inflation. Jamie suggested using LENS, or life expectancy, employment, your needs and your spouse's needs to determine the best age to begin receiving SS. Of course the longer you put off receiving SS, the more you will receive if you live into your 80's. Taxes are another item to take into (See SSA on Page Two)
