Turtles Were the Subject for the January Club Meeting

Dr. Mariana Fuentes, an Assistant Professor at Florida State University, spoke about her research projects from Australia to future ones in the Gulf Coast area.

Dr. Fuentes is a marine and conservation biologist, whose main research interests focus on conservation planning, natural resource management, and on climate change impacts on marine mega-fauna, especially marine turtles. She is currently undertaking a postdoctoral fellowship at the ARC Centre of Excellence for Coral Reef Studies to develop tools to systematically prioritize the management of marine megafauna under multiple threats, with the aim of enhancing allocation of limited resources. She has worked closely with government, non-government organizations and indigenous agencies throughout Australia, Barbados, Brazil, Kenya, Vanuatu and the USA.

Through her research, she is concerned with science that is applied to conservation and management issues, increase the knowledge and capacity of Indigenous communities to manage their own resources, use research as tool for teaching and engaging students and bring awareness to issues related to turtle conservation.

Full Moon Climb at Cape St. George Lighthouse

On Monday, February 22, the Sunset/Full Moon Climb will take place from 6:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. Climb to the top of the Cape St. George Light and watch the sunset and the rise of the full moon.

The sun will set at 6:34 p.m. and the "Snow" moon will rise at 6:43 p.m. on February 22. The February full moon is called the Snow moon because the heaviest snows generally fall in February. Full Moon names are attributable to native American tribes, most notably the Algonquin, who named the moons to mark the changing seasons. The Sunset/Full Moon Climb includes light hors d'oeuvres and a sparkling cider toast to the full moon. Cost is \$15.00 for the general public and \$10.00 for members of the St. George Lighthouse Association.

After sunset, people are invited to climb to the top of the lighthouse for a breathtaking view of the full moon, as space and time permit.

Funds raised by SGLA are used for the ongoing maintenance of the Lighthouse, the Keeper's House and Lighthouse Park, and this year will help fund a new exhibit featuring a replica of the Cape St. George Light's third order Fresnel lens. 
