Deputy Ryan Delgado Spoke at March Meeting

Franklin County Sheriff Mike Mock had a late emergency that he had to address, so he asked Sergeant Ryan Delgado to speak about actions that affect Islanders at the March Civic Club meeting. He had been asked to address underage golf cart drivers, ATVs and speeding on both Gulf Beach Drive and Pine Avenue.

He said that golf cart drivers must be 16 years old and have a valid driver's license. If stopped by a deputy, it is up to the deputy's judgment as to escorting the cart back or contacting the parent. ATV's are not legal on public streets in Florida unless they have proper lights and a valid license tag. Speeding will be addressed as detected. Both the Sheriff's department and the Florida Highway Patrol are being extra vigilant during this Spring Break. Several members present thanked Sgt. Delgado for the additional presence on the Island during Spring Break and the Chili Cook-off.

He asked members who witnessed persons ignoring stop signs or appeared to be intoxicated to call the Sheriff's office immediately.

There were also concerns that Sgt. Delgado couldn't address, but promised to take back to Sheriff Mock.

Apalachicola Antique & Classic Boat & Car Show

Apalachicola will host the 18th Annual Apalachicola Antique & Classic Boat & Car Show on Saturday, April 16. Antique boats, examples of classic and traditional vessels, workboats, and fiberglass and aluminum classics will all be on display throughout the day. This festival emphasizes the maritime history of our picturesque coastal town. Special highlights include home-built boats by skilled craftsmen, authentic oyster boats and workboats, antique outboard engines, plus antique automobiles and artist booths. The Apalachicola Maritime Museum will host tours aboard the Heritage, a 58-foot wooden Herreshoff-designed ketch and have demonstrations of steam engines with their beautiful antique steam powered vessels. The Apalachicola National Estuarine Research Reserve will have displays on the Apalachicola River and its flora and fauna, along with booths.

Here are 2 excerpts from the Florida Statutes on use of motor vehicles on public roads:

Title XXIII

- 316.212 Operation of a golf cart on public roads:
- (7) A golf cart may not be operated on public roads or streets by any person under the age of 14
- 316.2123 Operation of an ATV on certain roadways:
- (1) The operation of an ATV, as defined in s. 317.0003, upon the public roads or streets of this state is prohibited, except that an

- ATV may be operated during the daytime on an unpaved roadway where the posted speed limit is less than 35 miles per hour.
- (2) A county is exempt from this section if the governing body of the county, by majority vote, following a noticed public hearing, votes to exempt the county from this section. Alternatively, a county may, by majority vote after such a hearing, designate certain unpaved roadways where an ATV may be operated during the daytime as long as each such designated roadway has a posted speed limit of less than 35 miles per hour and is appropriately marked to indicate permissible ATV use.
- (3) Any ATV operation that is permitted under subsection (1) or subsection (2) may be undertaken only by a licensed driver or a minor who is under the direct supervision of a licensed driver.
