February Civic Club Meeting By James Donald, President

Forty-nine Members were in attendance. CC President, James Donald, welcomed the attendees and reviewed the agenda. SGI Fire Chief Jay Abbott was invited to do 5-minute overview of the 2018 Chili Cook-off, March 1-3. This year's event occurs at the same time during FSU's Spring Break and a larger crowd is expected. Jav noted that planning for the Chili Cook-off was on track but noted an urgent needed for more items for the Saturday's Auction. He asked members to help him get out the word concerning these needs. He thanked everyone for their support of SGI VFD Hat Fundraising Campaign to date, noting that hat sales were an impressive \$35,500 in the first six weeks of the drive. This was welcome news since 2016 and 2017 drives were \$22,000 and \$38,000 respectively for the entire year. Jay also modeled the SGI Chili Cook-off Sponsor's jacket that is available to those that make a \$100 donation.

Next, James introduced the featured speaker for the evening, Kevin Begos of Franklin Solar Co-op. Kevin described the Solar Co-op industry as it relates to opportunities in Franklin County. He discussed how beneficial

it was for the communities to band together to get the best prices for solar energy. He encourages anyone who interested to check out the prices as estimates are free. He also noted that in the past 5 years prices (See February meeting on Page Two)

(February meeting, From Page One) for solar energy have dropped dramatically and are now more affordable. This program will launch in Franklin and Bay Counties beginning April 10 and already 50 residents in Franklin County have shown interest. First step is to call or sign-up on on-line at https://www.solarunitedneighbors.org /florida/go-solar-in-florida/go-solarin-a-florida-group/ A licensed solar contractor will provide a written quote to include how much can be saved. Residents will enter into individual contracts. In addition to the energy savings, there is a 30% federal tax credit. Examples of cost were 4 KW house would cost \$8-9k to install. A 3000 sq. ft. home would need an 8KW system and which would cost approximately 20K but then you get the tax credit. Duke Energy would buy your excess energy and you get credit for when you need it. How much energy the system produces is based on your house positioning to the sun. Systems have a life expectancy of about 25 years. Camp Gordon Johnston Association's president, Mr. David Butler, then took the floor to discuss the upcoming 23rd Annual Camp Gordon Johnston Reunion Day parade on Saturday, March 10. There will be a reception at the American Legion on Friday, March 9. The museum has a board of 12 and is always looking for volunteers. Veterans from the island
