Political Forums Provide Access to Candidates

The St. George Island Civic Club held political forums on July 18th and 19th at the Jay Abbott Volunteer Fire Station on SGI. The forums were held to allow registered voters an opportunity to hear candidates in advance of the August 28th election.



Candidates for Tax Collector
Both forums were well received
with over 50 people in
attendance each evening. The

first hour was a formal panel of questions to the candidates, followed by a 30-minute Meet & Greet session with the audience. The panel portion consisted of an opening statement from each candidate, questions from the moderator, and a closing



Jay Gordon Shuler and Barbara Sanders for Franklin County Judge statement from the candidates. The audience was allowed to submit written questions for the question and answer portion.

Two of the three candidates for Franklin County Judge, Gordon Shuler and Barbara Sanders, appeared on Wednesday, July 18th; the third candidate, Roseanna Bronhard, declined the invitation to appear. The elected county judge serves a six-year term and must be a member of the Florida Bar. The trial jurisdiction of county courts extends to civil disputes involving \$15,000 or less. All five candidates for Franklin County Tax Collector appeared on Thursday, July 19th: Jamie Crum (R), Teresa Ann Martin (D), Connie Polous (NPA), Tami Ray Hutchinson (D), and Rick Watson (R). The elected tax collector serves a four-year term and is responsible for the collection of ad valorem taxes and other taxes set at the local level. Additionally, they act as an agent of several state departments, including the Department of Revenue, the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, and the Fresh Water Fish Commission. Early voting will be held August 13th to 25th, with the primary election on August 28th.

* In the judge's race, if none of the three candidates receive 50%+1 of the vote, there will be a runoff between the top two vote getters at the general election on November 6th.

* In the tax collector race, Jamie Crum and Rick Watson compete for the Republican nomination, and Teresa Ann Martin and Tami Ray Hutchinson compete for the Democratic nomination; the winners of those two primaries will compete against Connie Polous in the general election on November 6th.

A few tribes knew it as the Full Red Moon because, as the moon rises, it appears reddish through any sultry haze. It was also called the Green Corn Moon or Grain Moon.

This weekend event gives everyone an opportunity to enjoy
